An upcoming Logistics Association of Australia (LAA) breakfast seminar on 28 March holds potential strong interest for OR people.

Innovation in Supply Chain and Logistics - tips from a practitioner. Peter Carney, Aurecon.

"Innovation is the word on the lips of many in logistics. And in the fast changing world of supply chain and logistics the challenge to innovate is real. Increasing customer demands, short product life cycles, the advent of the internet, myriad new technologies and relentless cost pressures place significant demands on the supply chain function.





Being innovative helps, but how do organisations achieve this?

With a multi-disciplinary background in geology, computer science, finance and marketing Peter led the Supply Chain and Logistics Consulting group for ten years for one of Australia's major manufacturers, BlueScope Steel. In that time Peter's group implemented a broad range of improvements and considered a wide number of technologies for logistics.

In this talk, the secret formula for innovation will not be revealed - there isn't one - but Peter will share some observations about achieving improvements and some of the enabling conditions that made them possible."
